Start Them Young!

KnK Baby – A kart designed for the little kart driver, the KnK Baby is ideally suited for drivers between the ages of 4 and 7 years.

The Baby is fitted with heavy duty splinter proof moulded plastic bodywork designed to take impacts. It is powered by a reliable Honda 1.38hp four-stroke engine that drives the rear axle through a centrifugal clutch.

The specially made seat is designed to provide the driver the required support and keep him secure in the kart.

Strong chassis with 770mm wheelbase in red powder coated finish. Rear of the kart is protected with a bumper arrangement that also protects the rear wheels. The sides are fitted with heavy-duty impact absorbing moulded plastic pods. Front

protection is offered by an extra wide heavy-duty moulded plastic bumper.

Lightweight strong imported polymer wheels in bright red match the chassis and provide a fresh appearance to the looks of the kart.

This is the kart for rental circuits that can offer a first karting experience to children below 7 years.

KnK Prodigy

This is the race version of the KnK Baby, ideally suited for the champions of tomorrow, to hone their skills.

It is constructed the same to specifications for this class of karts by the governing

bodies in the USA, Great Britain and **Prodigy** boasts Australia. the features seen on race karts of higher categories.

The build quality of the Prodigy follows the same principals as those used in the manufacture of our race kart range. Dedicated jigs and processes including the "built by hand" tag goes with every Prodigy kart.

Honda with clutch The Prodigy was first built in 2004 for demonstrating at the

national Karting Championship in India. The Prodigy has been exported to the UK as well as Australia, where it is used as a trainer kart for the below 7 year old racers.

KnK Prodigy Front and Rear Bumpers are of CIK type design, which provides adequate protection to the driver's feet. The replaceable chromed steel bumper is mounted on the chassis member. Plastic nose cone is fitted using clamps like those used on race karts.

KnK - Steel disc rotor, strong caliper with large pads and twin-cable operation provide double security.
