RACING - CANADA

Jonathon Treadwell driving for KnK Karts North America brought home the coveted BSRKC Championship for KnK Karts in their first season of racing in Canada.

Going into the final round at Innisfil Jonathon needed to finish no lower than third to take home the honours.

Qualifying in third place at Innisfil meant he just needed to race his own race, and stay out of trouble.

He took the lead at the midpoint of the pre-final and earned himself a pole-position for the final when he won the heat.

In the final he led the way into turn one and immediately broke away with two other karts to race for the victory and the championship. Exchanging positions within the top-three positions throughout the twenty-five-lap feature race, Jonathon kept the championship in mind through the entire race, and although opportunity arose to move into second on the final lap, he decided to play it safe and finish with a third place finish.

Ending the season finale in a solid third place finish was all he needed to claim the Championship.

"I feel very honoured to win the championship for KnK Karts," commented Treadwell following the race in Innsifil. "Keith and Kevin (Barrick) have been very supportive this year, and I really couldn't have done it without them. They deserve this championship."

On the two-cycle side of things, Treadwell recently just completed the other half of the BSRKC, and finished the season fourth in points. The result may not be quite what the team wanted, but it was a step in the right direction.

Rotax National at Ipswich: Sept 4th & 5th. By the end of practice on Friday Craig Matthews and his KnK Trakhawk #74 had the fastest time of the day in the "Over 35" class with a grid of 36 karts. On Saturday Craig qualified 3rd fastest in a heavy downpour of rain. In the heat previous to the pre-final Craig's Rotax ingested a lot of water in the torrential rainy conditions and his engine refused to rev past 8,000 rpm and finally stopped. Craig was down in 11th for what everyone believed to be the pre-final. The horrid weather conditions forced the organisers to run the pre-final as the final and cut it down from 30 laps to 20. While Craig drove a strong race he couldn't



make better than 4th from 11th position when the checkered flag fell. Craig felt robbed since he believed he could have bettered his final result if the race format had not been changed due to the bad weather. But that's racing!

<u>Cooloola:</u> September 13th, Following in daddy's footsteps, little **Jace Matthews** drove a strong race in his Comer powered **KnK Juvenile** #8 in the cadet class to finish a solid **second**.

<u>Lakeside International Raceway:</u> Rally Attack Series - September 19th, **Nathan Pearce** drove a magnificent race in his **KnK Interceptor** with a standard Subaru against a field

of "Modified class engines".

Nathan finished *First* in the sealed engine class by a country mile and *Third outright* in this 30 lap "*Rally Attack*" race series event.
