Happy New Year from all of us at KnK Karts!!

The first newsletter of 2007 has us looking forward to a great year of karting ahead. If you are visiting the Autosport International Racing Car Show at NEC, Birmingham, UK, from January 11th to 14th, you can see KnK Karts at the Conquest Technologies Ltd. stand in the Karting Area of the show.

In 2007 the new range of KnK karts includes the Pathfinder and the Juvenile Cadet.

The KnK Pathfinder is a twin seat kart that is powered by an electricstart 4-stroke engine with four forward gears and reverse. A large battery is charged on board and provides sufficient power for the powerful roll cage mounted lamps and accessories like a hand held spotlight.



Long travel adjustable fully independent suspension lets the Pathfinder take on most types of terrain with relative ease. With a ground clearance of over 10 inches, the Pathfinder



almost anywhere. The exhaust and engine air intake are mounted up and away from the ground so traversing shallow streams and rivulets is not an impediment.

Rack and pinion steering makes maneuvering light and predictable. Hydraulic twin disc brakes on the front wheels and two hydraulic drum brakes on the rear wheels provide adequate stopping.

The driver and passenger are comfortably seated in rally type seats with seat belts behind an anti brush steel mesh windshield. Mudguard type wheel shields protect from dust, stones and water that the tyres might throw up. An over engine carry frame can be used to carry implements or be fitted with a net carrier for other smaller items; an overhead roof keeps the sun away. The driver seat is adjustable forward and back using a simple and guick track system.

The KnK Pathfinder is an ideal companion for the outdoor person living on a farm or for getting around large project sites.

Winning Ways - The Juvenile Cadet, Jake Mayes leads the field in his KnK on the way to an impressive win.



The KnK Juvenile Cadet is now MSA homologated. It is the first Indian kart to be homologated overseas.

The Juvenile Cadet can be raced in the Honda Cadet class as well as the two-stroke classes using Comer engines and the new proposed

Rotax Micro Mini class.
